

Using the Echo, they'll be able to request help, listen to their favorite music, order products, even hail a Lyft car...all with natural voice commands.




I'll order it straight from Amazon and have it delivered to them in time for their anniversary.

Bad idea




Not so fast...

Or their own Amazon account?




Not yet




Without a companion smartphone, your folks won't be able to setup the Echo or enjoy all of its features

Listen to your mother








For example, they won't be able to have the Echo call you just by saying "Alexa, call Frank."




But I want them to call me...



Don't worry. *It's easy to solve!* I'll tell you how.




First, you need to buy them a cheap smartphone



Why do they need one of those? They have a land line







Two reasons.

First, you will need a mobile phone number to set-up their Echo.




Second, the
Echo constantly checks with a companion app on the smartphone to see who your folks can call from the Echo.





So…let's say your folks want to call your sister from their Echo. Her name and phone number *must be added* to the app or the Echo won't be able to find her!



Really?

And we have a lot of friends too!



Put 'em in the app!







Does their new smartphone just stay in the house?

It can. As long as it connects from time to time via your folk's WiFi, it will work with the new Echo.

Do we have WiFi, lovey?

Yes dear. That's what makes the TV work.








Ok. So where can I get a *cheap* smartphone that will run the companion app?

Any phone that runs
Android 5.0 or higher will do the
job. Then just buy a minimum no
contract plan and you're ready to
start the set-up.

The ZTE Cintrine LTE from www.tracfone.com is a good choice






Once you have a companion phone and a "no contract" plan, you will have a new mobile phone number for your folks. Use that number to set them up with their own Amazon account.





Why can't I just use <u>my</u> Amazon account for them?

















1) A dedicated Echo 2) A dedicated Amazon account

3) A dedicated companion smartphone linked to your folk's Amazon account




Finally, fire up the brand new Echo and it will walk you step-by-step through the set-up process.

Remember son, these three parts belong to us:




1) Dedicated **Account**

> 3) Dedicated **Smartphone**










That's it. You're done. The Echo you bought for your folks will do a lot of cool things right out of the box. Plus...you can customize it with speciality skills and features that your folks will love!


